Another exciting term at Binnaway has started with lots of excitement as the calendar rapidly fills with overnight excursions and planning around end of year events as well as swim scheme coming up soon.

We are excited to see our numbers grow with four more new students already this term! This will impact on our planning for 2023 classes especially in primary. We will let you know what this looks like as soon as possible.



Gate opening arrangements have changed. More students have been arriving long before they are expected at school. There is not a teacher on duty until 8:35am so any child arriving before that time must sit quietly under the COLA at the front of the school. To ensure we know how many and who the students arriving early are we now require everyone to buzz in at the front gate until 8:35am. The teacher coming out on duty will now open the side gate for the students arriving on the bus when they start supervision. The side gate will be locked again once the bus students have arrived. The gates are there to keep some of our younger students who are inclined to wander safe and to ensure that we know when visiting adults are in the school ground.

I was part of a tender process this week where we reviewed applications from organisations interested in starting an after school program in 2023. Hopefully I will have some more information very soon.

With the weather warming up it is even more important to remind your child/ren to make sure they have a hat and water bottle everyday. Children without a hat need to play in the shade. It is still a bit cool in the mornings but we have been reminding students that as the day warms up taking off your jumper is a good idea – please make sure clothes are well labelled and the lost property basket is overflowing.

Unfortunately I need to ask parents to keep reminding students not to talk to strangers and not to accept gifts or pat puppies unless it is someone they know. There has been an incident of someone approaching students and whilst in this instance it was not a major problem we all need to be extra careful. The students were reminded of this at whole school assembly and in class but we would appreciate your help to continue these discussions at home.

Please ensure you know where your children are after school. Discussions with local police have suggested that young people from our school have been observed entering or leaving premises where they may be at risk of harm. Whilst we are confident that students are safe whilst at school we, as a community, need to work together to ensure they are safe in the community as well. If you have any concerns about the wellbeing of your children and would like some ideas of how to best help them please contact the school.



Chargrilled Vegetables, Cous Cous with Haloumi and Lamb

500gm lamb diced haloumi zuchinni red & green capsicum sweet potato moroccan seasoning ground cumin <u>Tzatziki</u> cucumber salt natural yoghurt



<u>To make tzatziki:</u> Grate cucumber into colander. Sprinkle with salt to remove excess moisture. Add 1 teaspoon garlic, 1 teaspoon cumin, 1 teaspoon olive oil, salt, pepper and cucumber to 1.5 cups natural yoghurt. Mix and set aside in fridge.	
<u>Chargrilled Vegetables & Haloumi:</u> Peel sweet potato and cut into thin slices. Remove seeds and cut capsicum into chunks. Cut zucchini into slices. Cut haloumi into strips. Preheat grill and spray with cooking oil. Cook vegetables and haloumi until char marks appear on top.	
<u>Lamb:</u> Spray grill and cook lamb pieces until brown.	
<u>Couscous:</u> Make couscous according to directions on packet.	
Roughly dice chargrilled vegetables and haloumi and combine with couscous. Serve couscous and vegetables with lamb pieces. Add tzatkiki to serve. Can be eaten hot or cold.
